2	Readers are Superheroes – Fly-By Celebration, and One School One Book Kick Off	11/2/2020	Parents of preK-3 students will engage in reading activities that support the implementation of the county-wide reading program from "The American Reading Company." The 100 Book Challenge program creates a culture to celebrate the act of reading at school, in the community, and at home. The program requires all students to engage in eyes-on-print time for at least one hour daily. The expectation is that students read for 30 minutes at school and 30 minutes at home. This aligns with our Comprehensive Needs Assessment which indicates the need for focus on enhancing reading fluency, comprehension, and vocabulary. Our county has recently received a grant to enhance the curriculum through interventions and community partnerships; therefore, we plan to continue our partnership with the Worcester County Public Library in effort to encourage families to celebrate reading within the community as well as to provide families with access to a wealth of books for their children. 			<p>members with evidence-based research techniques, strategies, and “take-a-ways” that are used in the program such as the Home Contract, Reading Logs, Step counting, and Power Goals. Based on the social distancing protocol for the school year, we will create grade level videos to be shared on our school website with links and resources to provide family members with information about the curriculum and ways to be a Home Coach and advocate for the program. In addition, this initiative will serve as the kickoff for our One School One Book Club One which is a literacy initiative that is aimed at increasing achievement in the area of reading comprehension. This focus directly aligns with our Comprehensive Needs Assessment. In addition, OSOB helps to foster a love of reading at home. This year our PAC team selected a trilogy that focuses on self-esteem and social emotional wellness. Faculty members and students will receive a copy of the book and learning activities to complete at home with family members that focus on the comprehension of a literary text.
